

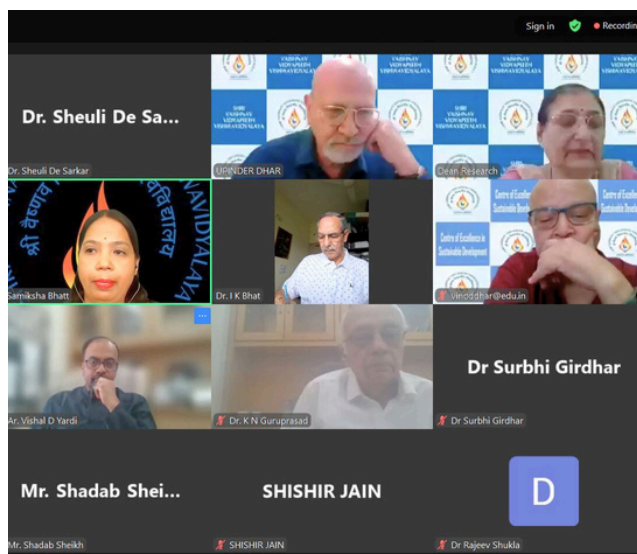


SVVV Organizes SHODH 2025: A Virtual Platform Advancing Interdisciplinary Research for Social Impact

विशिष्ट अतिथि डॉ. माया इंगले ने विष्णु पुराण के एक श्लोक के साथ अपने वक्तव्य की शुरुआत की।

मुख्य अतिथि डॉ. एल. के. त्रिपाठी ने अपने उद्बोधन में कहा कि हम गुरु पूर्णिमा तो एक दिन मनाते हैं, लेकिन पूरे वर्ष गुरु के मूल्यों को नहीं अपनाते। उन्होंने ब्लूम्स टैक्सोनॉमी और प्राचीन भारतीय ग्रंथों के बीच के संबंध की चर्चा की। उन्होंने नवीन विचारों पर कार्य करते रहने, महर्षि वेदव्यास के महत्व और उनकी रचनाओं को समझने की आवश्यकता पर बल दिया। उन्होंने कहा कि ज्ञान तकनीक के माध्यम से प्राप्त किया जा सकता है, लेकिन उसे स्वीकार करने की चेतना केवल एक गुरु ही दे सकता है। किसी भी व्यक्ति का व्यक्तित्व विकास उसकी सोच पर निर्भर करता है और यह सोच गुरु द्वारा विकसित की जाती है।

अंत में डॉ. अनुराग जोशी (कार्यक्रम संयोजक एवं सांस्कृतिक समिति समन्वयक) ने धन्यवाद ज्ञापन प्रस्तुत किया। कार्यक्रम का संचालन सुश्री अपर्णा सिंह द्वारा किया गया।

SVISSHA Political Science Students Explore Indore's Heritage Through Educational Visit

The workshop successfully achieved its objectives, marking a significant step forward in promoting digital healthcare literacy and better diabetes care among health and nutrition enthusiasts.

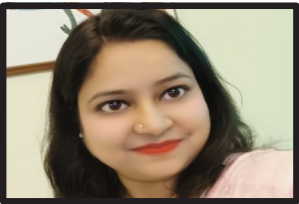


SVVV Hosts 7th Sir C. V. Raman Memorial Oration on Sustainability and Resilience in the Himalayas

Many formulations rely on preservatives, high sodium content, added sugars, and saturated or trans fats to enhance shelf life and palatability. These components, when consumed excessively, contribute to non-communicable diseases such as hypertension, cardiovascular disorders, obesity, and diabetes conditions already prevalent in the Indian population. Consequently, consumer education on interpreting nutritional labels has become paramount. Nutritional labels provide detailed information on macronutrients (carbohydrates, proteins, fats), micronutrients (vitamins and minerals), caloric value, and presence of additives. Key parameters to monitor include sodium levels, total and saturated fat content, sugar content, and presence of artificial preservatives or flavor enhancers. Recent regulatory frameworks in India, aligned with Food Safety and Standards Authority of India (FSSAI) guidelines, mandate clear labeling to facilitate informed consumer choices. Front-of-pack (FOP) labeling initiatives, including traffic light coding and nutrient profiling, are gaining traction to aid quick assessment of food healthfulness. In conclusion, RTE foods address the need for convenience in India’s fast-paced environment, a comprehensive understanding and scrutiny of nutritional labels remain critical for mitigating health risks and promoting balanced diets. Enhanced regulatory measures and consumer awareness campaigns are essential to ensure that RTE consumption contributes positively to public health outcomes.

Meaning: Itihāsa, Purāṇa, and Dharmaśāstra lead to ultimate well-being. They are said to be supports (upabrahmaṇa) to the Vedas. One who follows them is truly a knower of Dharma. Itihāsa does not merely mean "history"; in the traditional Indian sense, it indicates Dharma (ethics), Artha (statecraft), and Spiritual teachings. The first individual who compiled the Itihāsa for the Bharatvarsha was Sage Vyasa; it does not just include the Mahābhārata as we know it primarily. It includes the Vedas, Purāṇas, and the Great Epics, such as the Mahābhārata. The Epics are majorly known as Itihasa: The Ramayana and The Mahabharat. This Epics narrate actual events in this earthly realm, involving divine and human interactions with profound teachings of Dharma, Karma, Rajniti, and Moksha. Unlike its counterpart modern History which include only the political developments. The Purāṇas, which are 18 in number, narrate the cosmology, genealogies, legends, and philosophy. Itihāsa focuses more on the chronological events with epic dimensions, yet both overlap and are considered Smriti literature. Itihāsa and Purāṇas are not just historical records but spiritual companions to the Vedas. Itihāsa was not fabricated fiction but was believed to be witnessed by Divya-Drishti (divine vision) and was preserved for the moral and spiritual guidance of future generations.

SIF - A New Gateway to Investments

Securities and Exchange Board of India, has given permission to launch SIF (Specialized Investment Fund) from April 2025. This new category of asset class is more than mutual funds and below to portfolio management services. The permission for launching SIF for any Asset Management Company is granted with certain restrictions. Only those AMCs which are operating in the market for last three years and have more than ten thousand cores of assets under management for preceding three years can opt for launching Specialized Investment Funds. A chief investment officer having more than ten years’ experience of managing funds and have managed average Assets worth Rs. five thousand crores can qualify for it after SEBI’s approval. For any investor minimum investment in SIF starts with Rs. ten lakhs. SEBI has created different investment strategies for any SIF which are long-short equity funds, focused sector rotation, debt long-short funds, and dynamic asset allocation with up to 25 % short exposure capability. To reach to the investors SEBI has issued varied instructions to the promoters of SIF which are :-

- SIFs need to possess unique brand names and logos that are different from traditional mutual funds. To initiate recognition, AMCs can utilize the sponsor's/mutual fund's brand name for a period of 5 years by employing expressions such as "presented by" or "provided by”
 - The font size for the sponsor's/mutual fund's brand name must be the same as or less than that of SIF Assets Management Companies are required to have distinct websites or specific webpages for SIFs
- Is it right for me??
Before investing in SIF any investor must consider the following points
- Possess a minimum of ₹10 lakhs available for investment.
 - Interested in more advanced investment tactics.
 - Well versed with the derivatives market positions.
 - Do not require instant liquidity for their investments.
